From Mr. Odell's desk: (God's Word given to teachers each week and we want to share with you, also!)

Colossians 3:12-17

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12 Therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, put on tender mercies, kindness, humility, meekness, long-suffering; 13 bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if anyone has a complaint against another; even as Christ forgave you, so you also must do. 14 But above all these things put on love, which is bond of perfection. 15 And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to which also you were called in one body; and be thankful. 16 Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord. 17 And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him.

We labor together, my brothers and sisters, for the purpose of proclaiming the "good news" of Jesus. As we proclaim the reality and necessity of coming to saving faith in Christ we must protect against anything which will hinder us in this wonderful calling.

Paul lays it out very clear for the church at Colosse; as you live, minister and strive together watch careful that you don't let yourselves get in the way. The virtues that will protect us are stated in verses 12 and 13. These flow from and are only possible through loving each other in and with a Godly love.

Col. 3:16 is the hinge-point to this passage: God calls us to "let the word of Christ dwell richly in you". The dwelling or "in-working" of God's word should be rich or extravagant. The intent being that scripture should and must permeate every aspect of our lives and control every thought, word and deed. I pray that will be true of me and all of us in this vital ministry.
