#### Kindergarten Tidbit ~ Mrs. Odell

What a fun week we had in Mexico last week! We are off to Peru this week. We will be traveling to a new continent!!

In Bible, we will be learning the account of Jonah and how important it is to obey God's commands and follow Him. Our verse this week is a big one so be sure to practice at home!

This is a big week for phonics!! We will be introducing the long vowel! "When two vowels go walking, the first vowel does the talking and the second vowel is silent." The kids are going to be so excited to grow in their reading!

We will continue with our reading groups this week. Be sure your students are bringing their reading books back after taking them home. And don't forget to read with your student and sign the back of his or her book on Tuesday and Thursday.

In numbers this week we will be reviewing our clock reading, coins, "after" numbers, and addition families one through four. We will be introduced to the five addition family!

Don't forget to bring snow pants and boots. The kids love going outside! It's going to be a great week as we rest in the Lord and the power of His strength!



#### 2nd grade ~ Mrs. Bickett

Bible: Esther is Unselfish

**Verse:** John 3:16, "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." We will recite this verse on Friday.

**Phonics and Language:** We will continue learning about common and proper nouns, capitalization rules, and abbreviations for titles.

**Arithmetic:** We will review the difference between and concept of whole numbers, fractions and mixed numbers. We will learn the 16 subtraction family and how to do 3 digit subtraction problems with borrowing from the tens place, and how to determine halves.

**Spelling**: list 16 words. This is our first list with vocabulary words. Students will have to write the definitions as well as the vocabulary words on the test on Friday. Bonus words: sweatshirt, penguin, muscles, blizzard, synonym



**History:** This week we will learn about how America grew after the Revolutionary War. We will learn about the "Star-Spangled Banner" and "My Country, 'Tis of Thee".

**Handwriting:** Cursive lesson #1. We will write a verse on a border page in cursive by the end of the week.

### 4th grade ~ Mrs. Odell

Our Scripture focus this week is still Isa. 53: 5-7, I John 4:10, plus we are learning Ephesians 2:8-9 "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith – and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God – not by works, so that no one can boast."

Our "in-house" speech contest is coming right up. The children need to work on their speeches this week! They really are doing a great job. They are amazing!

We have been reviewing fractions in math. We are beginning a chapter on fact vs. opinion in Language. We will move on to list 18 in spelling. We will test on chapter 12 in history Thursday and then we will begin the chapter on the Civil War in history. We will also finish chapter 6 in science this week.
