1st grade ~ Mrs. Wilson

Bible – This week we will learn about God's written Word. Our memory verse is "I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you." Psalm 119:11

Phonics – This week we will learn about homonyms, as well as review A-B-C order, rhyming words, and opposites. This week's special sounds are -ea in thread, -ea in steak, -ie in brownie, -ey in key, and -ey in obey.

Math – This week we will introduce the 10 subtraction family facts, learn to how to tell time to five-minute increments, and identify units of weight and capacity. We will review adding two-digit numbers, before/after numbers by fives, and adding three numbers.

Spelling – please practice week #19 words at home.

Last Friday was the end of the 2nd Quarter. Report cards will come home on Wednesday.

2nd grade ~ Mrs. Bickett

Our in house speech contest will be on Tuesday, February 12th. I will let you know what time when I know. Please make sure your child has their speech memorized for the contest.

In Bible class this week we are continuing to learn about Esther. We will see how Esther was unselfish and how God used her to save her people. Our Bible verse is John 3:20: "Everyone who does evil hates the light, and will not come into the light for fear that his deeds will be exposed." We will recite this verse on Friday. We will also have spelling test 19 on Friday.

In math classes this week we will work on measuring with centimeters, 17 subtraction family, changing a multiplication sentence to an addition sentence, and Roman numerals.

In Phonics and Language class, we will identify simple subjects (noun) and simple predicates (verb) in a sentence, work on subject/verb agreement, and will learn to diagram the simple subject and verb.

In science class we are learning about animal habitats.
