We are starting our week with our "100 Day" party. The students shared their 100 day projects for the class. We counted and wrote to 100 and wrote 100 words we know.

We painted 100 dots in groups of 10 different colors and wore our 100 Day crowns. For our snack we counted out and bagged 100 different snacks in groups of 10. Then we ate them. We made necklaces of 100 Fruit Loops. We are 100 days smarter and boy does that make us smart!!!

Our Valentines Day Party is Friday, Feb. 12th. Each child will need a decorated box to hold the Valentines from other children. Thank you for your help on this.

In Social Studies this week we will fly to Kenya, Africa from Israel. We will taste cashews and cornbread. In Israel we greeted each other with "Shalom" but in Kenya we will have to learn Swahili to say "jambo" to say hi. We will try balancing a basket on our heads and walk around the room. That should be interesting.

In Phonics we will review letter name, sounds and sentences. Several special sounds will be introduced, like "ay", "st", "pl", "fr" and "tr" to help us read faster.

Pennies, dimes and o'clock will be reviewed in Numbers. We will learn the 6 family addition facts and spell the number words five and six. We will be reviewing all the addition facts, twins and doubles that we know.

Our handwriting is beautiful and we will continue to practice letters, words and sentences. We will have a written evaluation this week.

The Reading groups are going great!. We have great readers that need to continue reading for practice and smoothness. The students are now encouraged to sound letters in their heads before reading the words out loud. Reading with expression is practiced and they like getting a sentence with an exclamation mark.

Our Bible story is John the Baptist preparing for and baptizing Jesus. We are reminded we all sin and need to turn away from the sin after we ask for forgiveness. The Trinity will be introduced. We will talk about how we can tell other people about Jesus. Jesus is perfectly good and will take away the sins of the world. He wants all of us to know and spread the news his love, mercy and forgiveness is ours when we are a part of God's family.
