Kindergarten Tidbit ~ Mrs. Odell

We started off our week with a fun watercolor activity in Bible as we learned of the parable Jesus taught of the Sower and the Seed. This week we will be talking about the different types of "soil" our human hearts can be - hard, rocky, thorny, or good. We want our heart to be the "good" soil, so Jesus can root deeply into our lives and we can grow to be more like Him. Our Bible verse this week is James 1:22.

In numbers this week, we are learning how to tell the time at half passed the hour on the clock. This is an excellent activity to practice at home. We will also continue to review our coins and addition problems.

We will add more special sounds to our minds this week in phonics - bl, cl, fl, gl, br, dr. The kids are doing so well at reading. They love recognizing when a word has one or two vowels, and now they love finding those special sounds in the words we read. Keep up the great work reading on Tuesday and Thursday evenings.

We hope to go outside for recess some this week. Boots are so helpful so we don't have wet socks and muddy shoes. Feel free to even leave a pair in the classroom if you want to. We love the sunshine and fresh air!

1st grade ~ Mrs. Wilson

We have a new student in class! **Welcome**, **James!** James joined us this week and we are excited to have a new friend with us!

Bible – This week we will learn about Being Thankful- Jesus heals the 10 lepers. Our memory verse is I will tell of the kindness of the Lord, the deeds for which he is to be praised, according to all that the Lord has done for us. Isaiah 63:7a.

Phonics – this week's special sounds are: -wr in wrinkle, -ould in could, -air in hair

Math – This week we will introduce the 11 addition family. We will review 2 digit subtraction, fractions, clocks, temperatures, measurements, place value, 2 digit addition.

Spelling – Please practice List #19 words at home.

Classroom speech winners will recite their speech on Wednesday morning in the sanctuary at 8:30am. Please dress nicely. The school will video the presentation.

2nd grade ~ Mrs. Bickett

Wednesday our speech contest winners will perform their speeches in the sanctuary at 8:30. This will be video recorded and will be shared so that you may watch their performances or share them with family. Students who will perform need to look nice for their performance. They can bring clothes to change into for after the performance if they would like.

I will have a sign-up sheet outside my door, if you would like to have a conference.

Bible: Mary and Joseph Obey. This week we'll learn what humility and submission look like as we learn about how prophecy was fulfilled in the birth of Jesus and Mary and Joseph's responses to God's messages to them.

Verse: Matthew 1:21 "She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." We will recite this verse on Friday.

Phonics and Language: We are continuing to learn how to form contractions. We've learned that we use an apostrophe for missing letters of the shortened word. (is= 's, not= n't, have= 've, are= 're, will = 'll). We are also working on using verbs correctly and reviewing singular and plural nouns.

Arithmetic: We are continuing to do addition and subtraction problems that carry or borrow in the thousands place. We are learning what division is, the terms in a division problem and how to divide by 10, we'll also look at measures of weight in pounds and ounces and grams and kilograms.

Spelling: list 22 Bonus words: sombrero, mukluks, salmon, laundry

History: We will look at how the transcontinental railroad was built and how it opened up the west. We will learn about cowboys and cattle ranches and also how the railroad affected the Native Americans.



Bible - Memory Verse: "After they prayed, the place where they were meeting was shaken. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the Word of God boldly." Acts 4:31

English - We will be working with more contractions (is = 's, have = 've, is not = isn't, are not = aren't, was not = wasn't, were not = weren't). Test on Friday.

Math - We will be focusing on story problems. We will continue to work with converting measurements. We will start three digit division.

Spelling - List #24 Test on Friday

History - We will continue learning about Sacagawea.

Science - We will learn the process of the water cycle.

Health - We will start this week!

Animal Notebooks are coming home this week. The list of information and due date is in the animal notebook. Enjoy this project with your child and have fun!
