## Psalm 103:1-14

1 Bless the Lord, O my soul; And all that is within me, bless **His holy name!** 2 Bless the Lord, O my soul, **and forget not all His benefits**: 3 Who forgives all your iniquities, who heals all your diseases, 4 Who **redeems** your life from destruction, who **crowns you** with lovingkindness and tender mercies, 5 Who **satisfies** your mouth with good things, so that your **youth is renewed** like the eagle's. 6 The Lord **executes righteousness** and justice for all who are oppressed. 7 He made **known His ways to Moses**, His acts to the children of Israel. 8 The Lord **is merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in mercy**. 9 He will not always strive with us, nor will He keep His anger forever. 10 **He has not dealt with us according to our sins, nor punished us according to our iniquities.**11 For as the heavens are high above the earth, so great is His mercy toward those who fear Him; 12 as far as the east is from the west, **so far has He removed our transgressions from us**. 13 As a father pities his children, so the Lord pities those who fear Him. 14 For He knows our frame; **He remembers that we are dust**.

It is impossible to think of the love of God apart from his holiness. The reason is that God's character is encountered as he is, as the encounter with the one, almighty, all knowing, all powerful, ruler of all eternity. To put it clearly in our language of today God is "the whole package" or "the real deal". When examining the character of God, the absolute unity of God is clearly seen. David proclaims this truth in this Psalm. He begins with a call to bless God's Holy name and then proceeds to illustrate how God's Holy character spills out on us as those who are genuine believers in Him, those who trust in the redeeming work of Christ on the cross. All that God is flows from His Holiness, His complete "otherness" from us.

Take a moment this day to revel in the character of God and allow Him to penetrate our lives with who He truly is.

#### <u>1st grade ~ Mrs. Wilson</u>

In Bible we will be learning about Trusting God and the story of Peter walking on water. Our memory verse this week is "The Lord himself goes before you and will be with you, he will not leave you nor forsake you. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged." Deuteronomy 31:8

In Phonics this week, we are learning a new suffix rule: changing y to i when adding -er or -est. We are reviewing prefixes, suffixes, homonyms, A-B-C order, rhyming words, syllables, in addition to learning new daily special sounds.

In Math this week we are learning how to solve addition problems with three two-digit numbers. We are also reviewing measures, fractions, counting by threes, telling time, place value, long combinations (adding and subtracting 3, 4 and 5 numbers), and counting coins in mixed order.

Each student needs to bring in one empty cardboard egg carton (1 dozen size) this week for a class art project we will be doing next week on Wednesday. Thank you!

#### 2nd grade ~ Mrs. Bickett

In Bible class this week we are looking at what it means to be merciful. Our verse is Micah 6:8 *"He has showed you, O man, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."* We will recite this verse on Friday. Spelling Test 24 will also be on Friday.

In English class we are continuing to write a friendly letter. In math we will learn about how to find 1/3 of a group and a number and how to divide by 3. We are continuing to practice counting by 2's, 3's, and 4's and are working hard on our math facts.

#### **History** :

6<sup>th</sup> grade: We are wrapping up our studies of the United States with a look at modern leaders. Each student has been assigned a person of interest to write a research report. We will be beginning those this week together and writing them in class mostly. Students may take them home to work on them, but I will need them to be here. We don't have access to the computer lab for writing daily, so these will be had written.
