Kindergarten ~ Mrs. Ackerman

Here is a look at what we will be doing this week:

Phonics: We will learn these special sounds: *Spr in sprain, scr in scream, str in stream,* and *squ in squeak*. We will continue to meet in our reading groups! Homework will continue to come home on Tuesday and Thursday. <u>Please</u> have your child read with you when homework comes home. This is a very important time to practice, reinforce, and improve your child's reading skills!

Math: Review: before numbers in the Ones and Teens family, coins, clocks to the half hour, after numbers, and the 1 - 7 addition families. New Concepts: Fifteen on the clock and before numbers in the 20 family.

Science – God's Plan for Me: We will begin exploring God's world. Through this curriculum the students will see that God has a plan for each part of His creation. We will begin by learning that God has a plan for each one of us. We will explore our 5 senses and know that our senses help us appreciate and learn about God's creation. Our senses also help keep us safe. This week we will focus on the senses of sight and smell. Please send a baby picture of your child to school if you haven't done so yet. We will glue this picture in our science workbooks.

Bible – Jesus and the Children: The students will know that Jesus loves all children. They will show love to God and others in word and deed. Please practice Mark 10:14b. Daily memory verse practice will help your child put God's word in their heart. This homework should be an important part of your child's day!
