Thank you all for your understanding during this unusual time.






How to access your Abeka ProTeach Video Lessons:


Go to abeka.com. Click log-in on the blue bar. A drop-down menu will appear. Click "Student Video Lessons".

Log-in with your assigned user name and password.


• Your **user name** is the first letter of your first name plus your last name and grade level (all lowercase). Example: John Doe in 3rd grade would be: jdoe3



You will come to the Video Streaming page.



On the Video Screening page, scroll down until you see the ProTeach boxes. You can then choose your grade, subject, and lesson you need to watch.

Mrs. Cook's Jr. High News:

PCA 6-8th grade parents. I pray you and your family are well and that we can join together again soon. I find myself missing all of your awesome kiddos! That being said, I sent home a plan of work through April 2nd.

I will be uploading the Abeka assignment video links by Monday for the next lessons in history and Spanish (8th grade only). We modify somewhat from their structure, but these videos are helpful tools in understanding. I want the kids to do what I assign not what the teacher does.

We don't use Abeka for Literature, English, or 7th grade Spanish. Students have those assignments through April 2nd. I will be contacting via email or messenger new assignments and links to supplemental learning or review.

7th graders should finish Tom Sawyer by April 2nd.

I am concerned that both 7th and 6th grade continue in their English studies, so also look for daily writing assignments.

It is a huge adjustment and we thank Mr. Odell for his leadership during this time. I pray you and your family are well and living in the fullness of Christ our Lord!

8th grade Language Arts ~ Mrs. Kiser

Hello, parents! I hope all of you and your families are well! I am writing to give you some extra information on the 8th grade language arts homework. Our major writing assignment for this last nine weeks is the dreaded research paper. Since most of the researching part must be done individually, I felt this would be the best work during our shelter-in-place days. I sent home an instruction packet on Monday. All students except Isaiah who was ill have selected their topics. During this time they are to research that topic on computers, cell phones, magazines, or books. Then they need about 25 notecards (recipe cards) on which to take notes and identify sources.

They are to complete at least 3 source cards, one for each source they use, numbering each one in the upper right corner and listing info about the source as shone in the packet. Then they take notes from each source on other cards, using the same number on each notecard that is on the source card from which the notes are taken. If the source is a print source instead of electronic, they should include page numbers from which notes are taken. Be sure any quoted material has quotation marks around it.

When we come back to school, each student is to have at least 3 completed source cards and at least 20 completed note cards (filling most of the card) to turn in to me. If our time off is longer than expected, they may need to do some typing on the paper, but hopefully that can be done at school under my supervision. I will keep in touch about that.

Thank you for being involved in your child's education. My hope is that this will help to alleviate some idle hours and not be a burden to any of you. Learning is exciting, and I hope all of you enjoy discovering who these people really are and how their lives influenced the lives of so many others. As we continue reading Animal Farm, we will learn the tactics of control used in dictatorships. I think it will become apparent how the lives of these men are reflected in the book.

If you have any questions, please call or text me! Students may continue reading the novel if they choose, but we will do it together in class chapter by chapter when we meet again. Stay healthy and safe!
