

Our field trip to Starved Rock is around the corner, Thursday, April 29, we will go rain or shine. We love umbrellas and boots! Please remember to bring car seats if you are not driving. Drivers need to bring insurance copy and driver's license to the front desk to keep a copy on file. Every child will need a car seat. Bring a sack lunch, drink and wear appropriate clothing for the weather. We will leave the school at 9:00 and return approximately at 3:00 pm. We will have a snack and water bottles for the trip home. <u>Anyone interested in donating these, please let me know.</u> We are so excited!

For Graduation I need a count of how many will be attending in your family and guests. Please send me a message or stop in the room. There are Graduation Invitations at the front desk for 10 cents each. Graduation is May 19th at 2:00pm in the sanctuary here.

The organizers for Graduation Celebration are Krystal Bickett, Kristin McComber, Beata Dunn, and Heather Heaton, but they may need some helpers. Please see me or one of them. Also a donation of \$10 would be appreciated to help with expenses for food and decorations for Graduation.

We are practicing our poems and memory verses for graduation.

This week in Phonics we are adding the special sounds "ou" in "out". We will choose letters that complete blends, special sounds and words with ending and middle letters. We will continue to mark vowels and special sounds on most of our phonics paper work. We will think and write words to finish a sentence. Words will be scrambled and the students will need to put them in the correct order. It is very important to be reading at home and sending the Readers back each day.

For Handwriting we will be spelling words.

In Science we will start "God's Plan for Seeds". We are collecting different kinds of seeds to share. Whatever you find send in a baggie and mark what it is.

We are spelling numbers 1-10 and are doing great. Counting by 2's is getting easier but we will review counting by 10's, 2's, and 5's to 100. Clock review is on going but several times in the day someone will look at the real clock and say the time. That is awesome. We are reviewing 1–8 addition families . Sub-traction is still a bit tricky so any help from home will be great. Coins will be reviewed each day to increase our recognition and counting coins. We will have our last Math Store for this year. The students love this activity with coins.

Our Bible time story is Zacchaeus. We cannot hide anything from God. God loved Zacchaeus and God loves each of us. Zacchaeus was very unhappy at first but when he met Jesus his life changed. As we believe in Jesus and ask him into our hearts we will be changed too. We also should show love to other people we meet so we can tell them about Jesus.

Our memory verse is 2 Corinthians 5 :17 "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!"

1st grade ~ Mrs. Wilson

Bible – This week we are learning about King Josiah - Young Josiah seeks God and reads His Word. Phonics - This week's special sounds are -tion in nation, -sion in missionary, and -sion in television.

Math - This week we will review the 12 Subtraction Family, carrying to the tens column, greater than and less than symbols, story problems, telling time, place value, long combinations, and counting coins in mixed order.

Spelling – please practice week #25 words at home.

Last week we started our A-B-C Countdown to the end of the year. Our schedule for this week is: Monday – B – Bubbles – Bring bubbles to blow at recess! Tuesday – C – Crazy Sock Day – Wear crazy socks to school! Wednesday – D – Donuts – We will eat donuts for snack! Thursday – E – Exercise – We will do lots of exercise throughout the day! Friday – F – Favorite Book – Please bring your favorite book to school!



We will be joining 2nd Grade on a field trip to the Pin Splitter Lanes on Tuesday, May 18th. We will leave in the morning to play at Zearing Park (weather permitting) and have lunch at Zearing Park. Then we will go bowling at Pin Splitter Lanes and return to school before 3pm. Students will need to bring a sack lunch and drink. 2nd grade ~ Mrs. Bickett

Our class field trip will be on Tuesday, May 18th. We will be going to Zearing Park (weather permitting) in the morning and to have a sack lunch there before we go to Pin Splitter Lanes to bowl. The first grade will be joining us for this fun day and we are going to have a bus for transportation that day, More details will be coming soon!

Bible: This week we are learning how Peter's life was transformed through the Holy Spirit. He became self-controlled and very bold!

Verse: Our verse is 2 Timothy 2:17: "For God did not send us a spirit of timidity, but a spirit of power, of love and of self-control. We will recite this verse on Friday.

Phonics and Language: We have learned the definition of an adverb and are learning to identify them in sentences. We are finishing up our writing about our favorite season this week.

Arithmetic: We are continuing to estimate sums and round numbers to the nearest 10. We will also write numbers in expanded form and make measurement comparisons.

Spelling: list 29 Bonus words are: Illinois, perspire, casserole, circulate, and territory Our spelling test will be on Friday.

Health: This week we will focus on caring for our teeth, eyes, and ears. We will also talk about visiting the doctor and what to do in an emergency.

<u> 3rd grade ~ Mrs. Glass</u>

Bible - Memory verse: Hebrews 10:36. We will continue learning about Paul. We will learn about Paul's first two missionary journeys; how the crowd in Lystra treated Paul. We will learn how Paul trained and equipped Timothy.

English - We will learn that "A", "an" and "the" are used as adjectives. We will continue diagramming using subjects, verbs and adjectives. Test Friday.

Math- We will continue dividing with fractions as our remainder. We will use 10's and 11's as divisors. We will be dividing using money.
