

### <u>Kindergarten Tidbit - Mrs. Whitlock</u>

Our field trip is here! We will go rain or shine. We love umbrellas and boots! Please remember to bring car seats if you are not driving. Be sure to pay at the office here at PCA as I can only pay with one check. The students are free the whole day so you just need to pay for yourself and any siblings going along. Bring a sack lunch, drink and wear appropriate clothing for the weather. We will be at the museum first so park near the museum. We will leave the school at 8:15 and return approximately at 3:00 pm. I have a snack and water bottles for the drive home. We are so excited!



Our chicks are to hatch on Thursday of this week. If you are taking a few chicks please pick up your chicks on Friday afternoon. (FYI! We just had a chick hatch! Peeping has begun!! Exciting times!)

It is time to start looking at possible stories to be read at graduation. Help your child read and pick a few they enjoy reading so we can practice at school too.

This week we will celebrate Lily's summer birthday. We are also practicing our poems for graduation. There will be a substitute in our room May 3-6. The children know I will be gone.

This week in Phonics we are adding the special sounds "wor" and "igh". We will choose letters that complete blends, special sounds and words with ending and middle letters. We will continue to mark vowels and special sounds on most of our phonics paper work. We will think and write words to finish a sentence. Words will be scrambled and the students will need to put them in the correct order.

The unit "God's Plan for Seeds" will be finished this week. We have started to plant our garden and explored seeds with our magnifying glasses.



We are spelling numbers 1-10 and are doing great. Counting by 2's is getting easier but we will review counting by 10's, 2's, and 5's to 100. Clock review is on going but several times in the day someone will look at the real clock and say the time. That is awesome. Writing mixed numbers smallest to largest is finally getting easier. We are adding the 10 addition family this week and will review all addition families 1-9. Subtraction is still a bit tricky so any help from home will be great.

Peter's rescue from prison is our Bible story. We will learn that God hears our prayers and we can talk to him everyday and any place we are. Peter's friends prayed for him and we should be praying for our friends too. Our responsibility is to rely on God in faith and pray, pray, pray. Our memory verse is: "Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18
