PCA Student News Event

Congratulations William!!



William Marshall of Neponset, IL, a sixth grade student at PCA, recently attended Space Camp at the U.S. Space and Rocket Center, NASA Marshall Space Flight Center's Official Visitor Center in Huntsville, AL.

The weeklong educational program promotes science, technology, engineering and math (STEM), while training students and adults with hands on activities and missions based on teamwork, leadership and problem solving.

Marshall was part of the Space Camp program, which is designed for trainees who have an interest in space exploration. Marshall spent the

week training with a team that flew a simulated space mission to Mars. The crew participated in experiments and successfully completed an extra-vehicular activity (EVA), or spacewalk, and returned to Earth in time to graduate with honors.

Space Camp operates year-round in Huntsville, Ala., and uses astronaut training techniques to engage trainees in real-world applications of STEM subjects. Trainees sleep in quarters designed to resemble the International Space Station and train in NASA-inspired simulators.

More than 750,000 trainees have graduated from Space Camp since its inception in Huntsville, Alabama in 1982, including STS-131 astronaut Dottie Metcalf-Lindenburger, European Space Agency astronaut, Samantha Cristoforetti and NASA Expedition 48 astronaut Dr. Kate Rubins. Last year, children and teachers from all 50 states and 69 international locations attended Space Camp.

William's team, Dorado, won the Commander's Cup Award. The award is for the top team in engineering and STEM products. Each team is scored on their projects throughout the week, receiving points like the NASA astronauts when they are evaluated. William's second rocket launch sent his rocket above the clouds! also, he had the opportunity to meet retied astronaut Michael Foreman.

William is the son of Daniel and SDawn Marshall of Neponset. His mother, Dawn, teaches band and elementary music at PCA.

TRUTH TO TEACH BY

August 21, 2017

Psalm 19:7-9,14

7 The law of the Lord is perfect, reviving the soul; the testimony of the Lord is sure, making wise the simple; 8 the precepts of the Lord are right, rejoicing the heart; the commandment of the Lord is pure, enlightening the eyes; 9 the fear of the Lord is clean, enduring forever; the rules of the Lord are true, and righteous altogether. 14 Let the words of my mouth and meditation of my heart be acceptable in you sight, O Lord, my rock and my redeemer.

Read this the other day: "Some 1500 years ago, the warrior-chief of a primitive Germanic tribe bluntly questioned a visiting missionary. 'Why should I believe in this Jesus you tell me about?' The man of God answered, 'Because in Jesus Christ you will find wonder upon wonder – and all true."

Truly, the greatest wonder is that God has chosen to rescue believing mankind from their "lostness". As we read in the above text: Truth awakens us to reality. We must know the gravity of our condition as human beings. We tend to defect. We are false lovers. We are traitors – compulsively, blindly. We want the wrong things. We are doomed. Ecclesiastes 9:3 – "This is an evil in all that is done under the sun, that there is one fate for all men. Furthermore, the hearts of the sons of men are full of evil and insanity is in their hearts throughout their lives.

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TEACHER'S NOTES FOR YOU!

Kindergarten Tidbits ~ Mrs. Whitlock

The new kindergartners are off to a good start and are eager to learn to read.

We know our first letter sound I, i and will be adding U, u. We are choosing the correct picture card name that contains the letter sounds we know. The students are finding and circling the I,i and U, u in a group of letters. We are mixing up the alphabet and naming the letters correctly. We need lots of practice to be sure we know what each letter name is out of order.

In Handwriting we will write I,i and U, u.

A few new songs begin our day, help us line up, and teach us about the creation of God.

We are singing and saying familiar nursery rhymes and learning the new poem, "The Little Turtle" by Rachel Lindsay

1-5 is being reviewed with felt animals counting and matching the correct number.

We are also identifying same and different concepts. The students are putting numbers in the correct order and saying the numbers when out of order. Colors and shapes will be reviewed but we are doing great.

Our Character building is self control.

Our Bible story is God's creation. Talk to you child about all of God's amazing wonders. We are making a book of God's creation and singing a counting song. The memory verse this week is Psalm 24:1a "The earth is the Lord's and everything in it." We will recite this verse on Friday from memorization so keep working on it at home.

It is a busy first week in First Grade! In Phonics, we are learning to identify vowels and consonants, as well as applying the short vowel sounds and consonant sounds/blends to read words. Your child is welcome to prepare an "All about Me" poster. We will get to know one another just a bit better as they share.




Our afternoons are long and we are realizing that we have time to have a snack break around 1:30.
