## Kindergarten Tidbit - Mrs. Whitlock

The new kindergartners are off to a great start and are eager to learn to read.

Best quote so far; One child said, "We did our homework." Another child responded, "Wow, we are doing homework!"

Fun story: The first day of school several kindergartners left all their lunch supplies at the cafeteria table and went outside to play. I guess they thought someone would clean it up for them. Lots of teachable moments. They are all doing great as this is a big change in their lives.



Please check your child's pencil grip when he/she writes. They should grasp the pencil/crayon with their thumb and pointer toward the writing tip and rest the pencil on the side of the middle finger. It is important to get this correct position. Thank you.

We know our first letter sound I, i and will be adding U, u. We are choosing the correct picture card name that contains the letter sounds we know. The students are finding and

circling the I,i and U, u in a group of letters. We are mixing up the alphabet and naming the letters correctly. We need lots of practice to be sure we know what each letter name is out of order.

In Handwriting we will write I,i and U, u.

A few new songs begin our day, help us line up, and teach us about the creation of God.

We are singing and saying familiar nursery rhymes and learning the new poem, "The Little Turtle" by Vachel Lindsay.

1-5 is being reviewed with felt animals counting and matching the correct number.

We are also identifying same and different concepts. The students are putting numbers in the correct order and saying the numbers when out of order. Colors and shapes will be reviewed but we are doing great.

Our Character building is self control.

Our Bible story is God's creation. Hope many of you got to see the double rainbow on Thursday evening. It was so vivid and awesome. We are making a book of God's creation and singing a counting song. The memory verse this week is Psalm 24:1a "The earth is the Lord's and everything in it." Please practice at home.

God knows about all the animals, fish birds and each of us. He loves us so much.

God sure is powerful and very smart!

## First grade – Mrs. Wolbrecht

First grade has had a great start! The students and I are settling in to a routine and I am enjoying so much getting to know each one of your children better! The students were excited to have our school of guppies join our class this week! Students will have much review the first two weeks of school before we delve into new concepts. ### Jr. High News: Mrs. Cook

6<sup>th</sup> History –We are spending this year studying the Western Hemisphere. This includes exploration events including both North and South America. Also there will be an in depth study of Canada, the United States, and Central and South American cultures and geography. The focus is on geography, culture groups, and historical events.



7<sup>th</sup> History- We will begin this week with a study of ancient history beginning in the garden of Eden. We will study ancient Mesopotamia, Egypt, and the ancient Middle East during this first unit.

8<sup>th</sup> History- This class is an overview of American History with emphasis on geography, government, and historical events. Students are required to complete a constitutional study and test in order to complete this class. That study is taught during the second quarter.

All history students should expect daily quizzes over notes, occasional projects, and map assignments.

Projects will be assigned throughout the year. Students will have written rubrics of what is expected as they are assigned. These may include: power points, posters, art, written reports, current event speeches, and dramatic presentations.

All history classes are taught with Christian perspective.

#### Language Arts:

6<sup>th</sup> L. Arts- Students will have weekly spelling assignments and should expect to test every Friday. These begin next week. There will also be time devoted to writing and grammar. Our text this year is meant to introduce literary devices, so our writing should see much improvement as we imitate the masters of literature. We also will try to work in some novel reading and book reports.

7<sup>th</sup> L. Arts- Students should expect all of the same focuses as those in 6<sup>th</sup> grade, but with more opportunities for writing and with more mastery of concepts. We will read at least four novels one of which will be a Shakespeare work. Please note the annual trip to Navy Pier will be a combined trip with the 8<sup>th</sup> grade and parents interested in going need to sign up for that with Mrs. Kiser early.

All classes should expect opportunities to select and perform speeches at our local speech team meet in the spring. Opportunity for drama is open to all students in the Jr. High. Stage help, lighting, sound, and acting will be available.

7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade Spanish: This year students will do a more in depth coarse. The students should expect light homework, a daily vocabulary practice or quiz, conversational practice, scripture memory, and occasional projects.
