Band is growing and there is still time for your student to join! Please allow me to clarify the details.

1- Yes or no

First and foremost, I need to know whether your student will be joining band. Please let me know either way. I am at the school every day. You can catch me when you pick your child up, call the office, leave me a note (to the right of the office are teacher mailboxes, mine is marked "Dawn Marshall – Band Instructor") or call (309) 594-2221 and leave a message.

2- Instruments

Your student will need a quality instrument to play. You have 3 options: borrow, rent or buy.

The school has one (1) clarinet available to borrow, for only the modest cost of repairs.

Kidder Music offers quality instruments to rent and each payment automatically goes towards the purchase of that instrument. You may also purchase an instrument outright from Kidder Music. There are Kidder Music brochures next to the office. Our representative is Casey Doremus.

I also know a trustworthy and seasoned instrument repair technician, who has several instruments available for immediate purchase. She graduated from the prestigious Red Wing instrument repair school in Minnesota and has been skillfully repairing instruments in her own shop for over 20 years! The instruments are quality horns, thoroughly play tested and very reasonably priced. She currently has one (1) clarinet, one (1) trumpet and two (2) flutes for sale. Please contact me for pricing.

If you already own an instrument, but it requires repair, we must get it to Kidder Music today!

The shop is extremely busy and it can take up to two (2) weeks to complete the repairs.

3- Lessons

I am available for private lessons. The lesson fee is \$30 per month, for one half hour (30 minutes) lesson each week. Lessons will be scheduled during the school day. We will use the Hal Leonard Essential Elements method books (book 1 with a yellow stripe across the top), which are available for purchase from Kidder Music or online from Amazon.com. Your beginning student needs private lessons. Established students are encouraged to take private lessons. I will start private lessons in October.

4- Accessories

Each instrument requires different accessories, such as reeds, cork grease, oil and cleaning cloths. The cost for a new student to get started is **usually \$25** or less.

5- Non traditional band instruments

I am happy to include students who play a non traditional band instrument in band! Please come talk with me and we can discuss the possibilities.

6- Hesitations

Last, but definitely not least, if you have any hesitations about band please contact me. Please feel free to share and ask questions. I really want every student who desires to learn an instrument and be part of band to be able to do so.

Kindergarten Tidbit - Mrs. Whitlock

We had a great day with our Grandparents last Friday and we were so glad so many came to spend the morning with us. I am so proud of the boys and girls as they shared many songs, phonic and math skills with our Grandparents.

Watch for more details about our field trip to Boggio's Orchard on Tuesday, October 18th. If you would like to drive for this outing please check with the office for paper work to complete to be able to drive.

We earned our 10 scoops of ice cream for great line and hallway voices and actions.

We had our ice cream party on Monday.

This week we have lots of learning to do as we count to 20 in Numbers and learn "more" and "greater" concepts. We will look at and discuss what numbers come "after" other numbers. Graphs will be introduced and "careful listening" exercises will be practiced. We will continue to write the numbers adding "4" this week. Number games will continue to help us with our recognition of numbers 1-13. We will introduce the "teen" family of numbers.

In Phonics the students will learn the letter N, n and the sound it makes. We will add N, n to our consonant and vowel blends. The boys and girls will make and read words with T, t, L, l, B, b and N, n blends by adding consonants to the end of the blends. Example; to "Ba" blend we will add the consonant "t" and make the word "bat". The students are so excited to be making and reading real words. We will also make small words that begin with vowels. All of our vowels and consonants sentences and sounds will be reviewed and practiced in "Handwriting" too.

Dentist, Postal employees and the Mayor's job in our community will be introduced in Social Studies. Dr. Puhr has donated new toothbrushes and toothpaste for our class. We will practice the correct way to brush our teeth.

Telephone politeness will be practiced along with politeness in other situations and what impoliteness is will be discussed in Skills Development.

We will review "light and heavy" opposites along with "stop and go", "big and little".

The students will continue to identify "right and left".

The poems "Who has Seen the Wind" and "At the Sea" will enrich our language along with music and songs.

Our new memory verse is "For nothing is impossible with God" Luke 1:37. We will look at how amazing and wonderful God is to us and to Abraham and Sarah. We can trust God to keep all His promises as Abraham and Sarah did. There was great celebration when Isaac was born. We will make an "I am Special" book and end the week sharing our baby pictures with special notes from our families. We will have a classroom party and celebrate the "fearfully, wonderfully made" kindergartners (Psalm 139:14). God loves us so much and He made each of us special.

Please check your child's B.E.E. binder for a note regarding the celebration we will have for each of us.

It will be a surprise for the students!
