Kindergarten Tidbit ~ Mrs. Whitlock

Boggio Field Trip is Tuesday October 6th. Check with the front office if you would like to drive.

This week we have lots of learning to do as we count to 20 in Numbers and learn "more" and "greater" concepts. We will look at and discuss what numbers come "after" other numbers. Careful listening" exercises will be practiced. We will continue to write the numbers adding "4" this week. Number games will continue help us with our recognition of numbers 1-19. The boys and girls have received number flash cards to play our number games. They now know the "ones family" and the "teens family" of numbers. We will work for random recognition. Any practice at home will be appreciated.

In Phonics the students will learn the letters B, b M, m and N, n and the sound they make. We will add B, b and N, n to our consonant and vowel blends. The boys and girls will make and read words with T, t, L, l, B, b and N, n blends by adding consonants to the end of the blends. Example; to "ba" blend we will add the consonant "t" and make the word "bat". The students are so excited to be making and reading real words. We will also make small words that begin with vowels. All of our vowels and consonants sentences and sounds will be reviewed and practiced in "Handwriting" too.

We will continue our Community Helpers.

Our new poems are "At the Sea" and "Who Has Seen the Wind?"

Telephone politeness will be practiced along with politeness in other situations and what good manners are will be discussed in Skills Development.

The students will continue to practice "right and left" recognition, but most the time they know.

Our new memory verse is "For nothing is impossible with God" Luke 1:37. We will look at how amazing and wonderful God is to us and to Abraham and Sarah. We can trust God to keep all His promises as Abraham and Sarah did. There was great celebration when Isaac was born.



Kindergarten Continued...

We will be sharing our baby pictures with the special notes from our families during Bible time. 1st grade ~ Mrs. Wilson

Bible - This week we are learning about Jacob and Esau. Our memory verse is Psalm 34:13 “Keep your tongue from evil and your lips from speaking lies.”

Phonics – This week we will begin to learn chart 7 special sounds, as well as continue to review chart 6. This week’s special sounds are -fl in flake, -gl in glue, -br in bride, -dr in drum, -pr in pray, -gr in grin, -sm in smoke.

We will also review the c/k rule that we learned at the beginning of the year.

k comes before i and e; c comes before the other three – a, o, u.

Ex. kite, keep – cat, cot, cut

We will also introduce a the ck/ke rule:

When you hear the “k” sound at the end of the word, remember this spelling hint: ck follows a short vowel and ke follows a long vowel. Ex. lick, like

Math – This week we are learning about the dime, as well as comparing dimes and pennies, and counting by tens. We will introduce the 6 Addition Family Facts and review place value (tens/ones). We will introduce the concept of between numbers and learn to identify the greatest of 3 two-digit numbers. (Hint: look at the tens place first) We will also continue to review days of the week and months of the year in calendar time and math time.

Spelling – please practice week #2 words at home.

Last Friday was the end of our first quarter progress report term. Progress reports will be sent home this Wednesday.

Mark your calendars! We are going on a field trip to Boggio’s with the Kindergarten Class on the morning of Tuesday, October 6th. We will leave the school around 8:15, to start our tours at 9. Everyone needs to bring a sack lunch and drink. We will finish our trip with lunch at Boggios. We should be back at the school around Noon. Parents and siblings are welcome on our trip. Please see the note that went home on Monday night and return the bottom portion to school.



2nd grade ~ Mrs. Bickett



Reminder: Homework reading is to be read once silently and then once out loud to an adult or older sibling who reads well.

Bible: This week we will learn the definition of diligence as we learn about the children of Israel in the desert. We will see how God gave them the Ten Commandments. Our verse is Romans 10:9 "That if you confess with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved." We will recite this verse on Friday.

Phonics and Language: Chart 8 and 9 special sounds, identifying declarative and interrogative sentences and adding correct capitalization and punctuation to sentences and identifying the subject and predicate parts of a sentence.

Arithmetic: addition families 1-8, subtraction families 1-8, telling time to the half hour, counting money, identifying half of a group, reading thermometers and vertical bar graphs , using tally marks to complete a survey, and elapsed time.

Spelling: list 5 words. Bonus words: language, Michigan, station, science, and calendar

Science: We will be learning about animals and their habitats.

3rd grade ~ Mrs. Glass



Bible - Memory Verse: Luke 6:40. This week, we will be learning about Jesus's 12 disciples. We will be learning about the miracles that were performed by the disciples, but through the Holy Spirit.

Math - We will be working with money, starting cross multiplication, and learning our multiples of 4. Math Quiz Friday!

English - We will be learning that a noun is a person, place, or thing. We will continue to recognize if a sentence is declarative, imperative, exclamatory, or interrogative. We will continue to recognize our subject and predicate parts of a sentence.

Spelling - List 5 Test on Friday

History - We will be learning about Squanto, the Native American who helped the Pilgrims survive in the New World.

Science - We will finish up Chapter 7 and learn about our last section of animals-the invertebrates. There will be a quiz on Tuesday over pages 158-177. There will be another quiz on Thursday over pages 178-199. On Friday, we will have the test over Chapter 7.



4th grade ~ Mrs. Odell

We are beginning to learn of God's attributes. The first one is that He is omnipresent. We are beginning to memorize Psalm 139:1-14.

The children are beginning a chapter book *Song of the Brook* on Friday. It is a sequel to *Secret in the Maple Tree*. They need to read a chapter every day for homework and we will do a book report on it when it's completed.
