Kindergarten ~ Mrs. Bullington

Hey Kindergarten Families,

We are so excited to be back in school learning and having lots of fun!

In Bible, we are talking in greater detail about the fall of man, about God's promise to send a deliverer, and about Noah and the flood. In Bible memory we have memorized Psalm 1:1-3, Psalm 23, and Romans 3:19-26, and are mastering Romans 4:2-5.

In phonics, we are reviewing all of our special sounds and vowel teams! I am doing individual reading with each child to help them each read to their full potential, but we are getting ready to have any family members who would be interested in coming to hear children read! Please text or Facebook message me if you or a family member would like to help maybe once a week or whatever works for your schedule! The times that work best for us are 8:10-9:10 Monday-Thursday. We will start having all you wonderful volunteers come to the classroom next week!

Readers that come home are not mandatory, but the more practice your child gets, the quicker they will take off with their reading! Some nights you may be too busy to do readers, and other nights your child may even be asking to read it twice through—whatever works for your family. When they have read their reader 6 times between home and school (there are spots to sign on the back!), they get a prize! These kids are doing amazing! If you have any questions about how to help your child with his/her reader, please ask!



In numbers, we are learning the values of coins, and reviewing and practicing number families, counting by 10s, 5s and 2s, reading the hour hand on the clock, and doing simple addition.
