Our Boggio's field trip is Tuesday, October 23rd. We will leave the school at 8:10 am. The students will be free but adults and siblings the cost will be \$6 for a hayrack ride, apple, cider tour and pumpkin picking. If you want to just ride the hayrack it is \$1. We need drivers and car seats for all the children. If you are able to drive please see the office for paper work and copies of your license. Please let me know if you can drive or text me. The students and parents need to bring a sack lunch and drink for lunch that day. We will return to school to finish our day at school after our lunch at Boggio's.

We will continue to talk about our Community Helpers unit in Social Studies. We will have our Veterinarian clinic set up for free play with lots of stuffed animals.

In Phonics we will be adding the letters C, c, and S, c with their sounds and blends. The boys and girls are reading lots of words using our blends as we practice sounding new words after we add the ending letter sounds. The sight word "the" is everywhere and we can find it. We added the sight word "I" this week and "to". The students will name letters "after" when they hear a group of letters. The class will start spelling and writing words. The students should be able to name the beginning letter of a word using; t, I, m, n, b, or h. There will be a Phonics evaluation.

We will write our new letters in Handwriting and continue to practice all our letters. We will also be writing words with our letters. The students did an awesome job last week writing the letters "m" and "h".


In Numbers we will be making the teen numbers with our flash cards (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, and 16). Number recognition will be evaluated. The students will identify missing numbers in a line of numbers and more, less and same groups will be identified. We will learn to write the number 6 this week.

The Bible Time focus is on Moses as he fulfills God's plan to free the people of Egypt. Nothing is too difficult for God. He can take any of our situations and make something good out of it.

Phonics – This week's special sounds are -thr in three, -ar in stars, -ch in church, -or in morning. We will review the cK/ke rule – when you hear the *k* sound at the end of the word and the vowel is short, you write *ck*. When the vowel is long, you write *k* and silent *e*. We will also review compound words and three things we need for a sentence – begins with a capital letter, ends with a punctuation mark, group of words that express a complete thought.

Math – We will introduce the 7 Addition family. We will also continue to review before and after numbers by ones, practice counting by fives and counting nickels, and review counting dimes and pennies.

Spelling – please practice week #7 words at home.

Please check FISH binders for homework assignments. Thank you, parents, for initialing the homework sheets! We have twelve tallies and need just eight more for our class popcorn party!

Please make sure you are signing your child's homework sheet. We are trying to earn a popcorn party and do not get to add a popcorn piece unless everyone has their homework signed. We are halfway to our popcorn party. We need 12 more popcorn pieces!



In Bible class this week we are learning about Joshua. Our verse is "Do not let this Book of the Law depart from your mouth; meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful." We will recite this verse on Friday. We will also have spelling test 7 on Friday. Bonus spelling words for the week are: agreeable, graham, assume, ignite, and protection.

In math classes this week we will work on the 10 subtraction family, 11 addition family, measuring to the nearest inch and half inch, and solving multi-step story problems.

In Phonics and Language class we will continue working on chart 10 special sounds. We will continue to identify the subject and predicate parts of a sentence, as well as identifying declarative and interrogative sentences. We will continue to divide words into syllables between a root word and a suffix and between double consonants.

In history we have finished our unit on the Separatists. We will begin a unit on Native Americans.

Book- It has begun. Your child needs to read at least 120 minutes during the month of October to earn a free personal pan pizza from pizza hut. A form to keep track has been sent home with your child. It can be turned in the last week of October.

4th grade ~ Mrs. Odell

We are memorizing/singing Psalm 139:1-14. Please read this with your child. It holds such precious truths. God is omnipresent and omniscient and omnipotent and every child is so special to Him-- beautiful!

We will be working on averaging and 3-digit multiplication in math (keep on reviewing those facts). We will test on Chapter 4 in history Wednesday, and then we will begin learning about the New England Colonies. We are continuing the study of nouns in English. We are still marveling at God's amazing plants in science! We are testing on list 7 in spelling Wednesday.

Mrs. Cook's Jr. High News:

6th History: Chapter 4 test is tomorrow. Students need to study the map of the Atlantic States and those South of the Ohio River. We have been reviewing notes for two class sessions. They were given practice maps in their notes. It will be states and capitals only.

7th History: This class has begun the architecture project. This is due Oct. 30th. Students have an informational page. We are studying the Greco- Persian Wars.

8th History: Students are working on colonial shadowboxes Due This Friday. We tested over the French and Indian War as well as Colonial Era themes today. We will continue testing tomorrow.

6th Language Arts: Spelling List 6 this week. Also, Test over Rascal will be Thursday. Students should be working on a writing project. We are doing most of the actual writing in class, but editing, rewriting, ect. will be done on our own. Their plans were due today and are in Chapter 2 of their English workbook. Have them show you what they have done nightly. They should be adding one paragraph per day and have at least 5 paragraphs when completed.

7th Language Arts: We continue our study of Treasure *Island*. Students should be reviewing their vocabulary and characters. We plan to finish this week. . Students should read 29 today in class, chapter 30 on their own. Quiz Tomorrow over reading. Wednesday we will read chapter 31 in class and most of 32. They will have to finish that at home. They should finish the story Thursday, review Friday, and test on Monday. We are also writing a short story in Language Arts this week. The focus is on strong plot and character development.

Spanish: 8th We are studying chapter 11 and 12 vocabulary this week. We will quiz on Friday over these. This week we are studying helping verbs and the irregular verb DAR. We will be writing a short report found on p.158

Spanish: 7th graders have been introduced to the irregular verb estar! We are working on our vocabulary.
