Kindergarten Tidbit ~ Mrs. Whitlock

Conferences are next week, Oct. 19th-22nd.

There is a sign up sheet for conferences on my door. Please see me if you need a different time.

Our Boggio trip was so much fun. God blessed us with a beautiful day and an awesome bus. Thank you Mr. Doug. Thank you parents for joining us if it was possible. Last week we did several pumpkin activities and have a few more this week. If you carve a pumpkin, I would like to let the students taste roasted pumpkin seeds. Please let me know if you have some I could have.

We have a busy week in Phonics as we introduce the letter, sounds, blends and words that D.d. and G, g make. We will review all letters, sounds, blends and words we know. "to" will be added as a sight word along with "the", "a" and "the". We will play "Capture the Card" to see how many sounds, letters, blends and words we can capture for our team. We will have an oral evaluation in Phonics. The students have their Blend books and they will be able to bring them home soon. Please have your child read to you the blends they have learned and sign inside the back cover and date it. They are very anxious to show you.

This week we will describe how pairs of words are alike/different in Language Enrichment. We will act out what it means to be truthful. Our poems will be reviewed and we will be "Going on Bear Hunts". Opposite concepts for "full/empty" and "asleep/awake" will be looked at. We finished our Community Helpers and will start "America-Our Great Country" in Social Studies.

In Hand Writing, the students will trace and write the letters D, d, G, g. They will write words that start with D, d and G, g. Lower case "g" is our first letter that goes in the basement when writing. This is will be fun for the students but challenging. We will practice writing the letters we have learned and write words that include our learned vowels and consonants.

Kindergarten Continued...

Our word wall is growing with the words we can read. There will be a written evaluation in Handwriting.

Tale a look at our Handwriting papers outside our room.

In Numbers and Skills Development we will practice "left and right". The students will review shapes adding diamond, oval and hexagon also identifying corners and sides.

Pennies and counting will be reviewed as we count including the word "cents".

The numbers 17 and 18 will be introduced with sight recognition, counting groups of objects and forming the numbers with our flashcards. Please keep counting at home as the teen numbers can be tricky to include all of the them when counting. The students will have a written number evaluation sheet to complete.

We will write the number "7" and practice 1-6. Number words will be introduced.

The story of Samson is our Bible Time focus with the memory verse in Matthew 6:13

"And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one." The focus will be on strength to be kind, strength to obey and strength to do my best.

As I studied the focus for Bible Time, I heard the song "You have Made Me Glad". "You are my shield, my strength, my portion, deliverer, my shelter, strong tower, my very present help in time of need." Awesome words and what an awesome God we worship.

I hope everyone enjoyed the long weekend!

Bible - This week we continue to learn about Moses and the Ten Commandments. Our memory verse is "This is love for God: to obey His commands." 1 John 5:3a

Phonics – We are starting on Phonics Chart #8 this week! This week's special sounds are -thr in three, -ar in stars, -ch in church, -or in morning, and -ou in out. We will review the cK/ke rule – when you hear the k sound at the end of the word and the vowel is short, you write ck. When the vowel is long, you write k and silent e. We will also review compound words and three things we need for a sentence – 1) begins with a capital letter, 2) ends with a punctuation mark, and 3) it is a group of words that express a complete thought.

Math – We will introduce the 7 Addition family facts, before and after numbers by tens, and combining nickels and pennies.

Spelling – please practice week #5 words at home. We have a short week, but 10 of the 12 words end in our special sound -ay. Our spelling lists have increased to 12 words each week.

Please continue to fill in your child's Pizza Hut Book It October reading calendar. It is due back at the end of the month.

We will also start show and share this week. Each week a few students will get to bring in something special to share with their classmates.

Parent/Teacher Conferences are coming up soon. I will send home a schedule this week. Please return it with your 1st and 2nd choice of days/times. I look forward to meeting with you!

Bible: Joshua Obeys God

Verse: We are reviewing Romans 10:9 and Romans 10:13

Phonics and Language: Special sounds: ed, wh, tch, and ear. Identifying root words and suffixes, identifying the complete subject and predicate of a sentence, compound words and capitalization and punctuation of sentences.

Arithmetic: subtraction family 10, reading a ruler to the inch and half inch marks, solving 4 addend addition problems, solving 2 digit addition problems and addition family 11.

Spelling: list 8 words. No bonus words this week,

Science: We will learn where scientists work and how things work together.

8th: We are finishing up on Newton's 3 Laws of Motion then we will be going to Forces in Nature. Force of Gravity, Gravity with weight and acceleration of gravity. Centripetal and Centrifugal Forces. Of course will include their favorites = equations.
