<u>Kindergarten Tidbit - Mrs. Whitlock</u>

We are so glad that Kristoffer is back from vacation, we have really missed him. Nolan Clausen is joining our class this week and we are excited to have him.

Conferences are Oct. 24-27th. There is a sign up sheet on my door. Please let me know if another time is better for you.

Report cards will be handed out at conferences or Wednesday, October 26th.

This week we will be evaluating in most areas. In Phonics we will add the letters R, r, F, f, and J, j in sounds, recognition, blends and read words that include all the letters we know. The children are reading many words, making words out of blends and using the words in sentences. We have two site words; "the and a". We will add "I" this week. The students will start writing the words, they can read, to add to our word walls. The students will read phrases and match pictures to the correct phrase (ex; the hat)

R,r, F, f and J, j will be introduced in writing and we will practice these and then read the blends and words we write.

In Numbers all the teen family will be evaluated for recognition, forming them with our flash cards and board work. We will count to 20 recognizing what comes before and after the 20 family. Random number recognition will be evaluated 1 -20. The 20 family will be introduced and we will count to 50 as a class. At our store we will shop and count out pennies to pay the correct price for different objects. This class has awesome math skills and number smarts.

Language Enrichment and skills introduces us to "gravity and different categories objects can be grouped. Students will be introduced to "Swing" a poem by Robert Louise Stevens. The class loved the "Bear Hunt" so we will recite and act it out again. We will talk about what "respect" means and how we can show respect. Opposites "full and empty" and "full and empty will be taught.

In Social Studies: Our Great Country takes us to the stories of Christopher Columbus, the Pilgrims and how the Unites States of America is blessed by God.

Our Bible Time focus is Samuel. Our memory verse is in Joshua 3:9b. "Come hear and listen to the words of the Lord your God." The children are doing wonderful reciting all their memory verses. May these verses be in their hearts all their lives. ~Mrs. Whitlock

4th Grade - Mrs. Odell

We have memorized/sung Psalm 139:1-14. Please read this with your child. It holds such precious truths. God is omnipresent and omniscient and omnipotent and every child is so special to Him -- beautiful! We are also learning Colossians 1:15-17: "He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. For by Him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities: all things were created by Him and for Him. He is before all things and in Him all things hold together."

We will be working on double digit division and more measurements – both standard and metric in math. We are learning about the Middle and Southern Colonies in history. We have finished friendly letters and will be learning about verbs in language. We have begun the marvelous world of birds in science! We are testing on list 9 in spelling Wednesday.

We have been talking of some of the struggles of pioneer life and we would like to do some pretending for a day on Thursday, October 27. The children may dress "pioneer" like or even Western and we will attempt to do without electricity in the classroom. I think it will be an "eye-opener" for all of us!
