TEACHER'S NOTES FOR YOU!

Kindergarten ~ Mrs. Bullington

We are having lots of fun learning in Kindergarten! This week in Phonics, we are reviewing double vowels and teaching vowels + ng/nk. The kids are doing an amazing job of learning to read!

We are continuing to read about the American Revolution, to practice addition, to learn about land and water forms, and to learn about Jesus as The Lamb of God.

We have memorized Psalm 23, and we are starting a new passage for Bible memory--beginning in Romans 3:19, and we will memorize all the way to 4:5. This passage is so important for every believer in Jesus to know!

1st grade ~ Mrs. Baker



We have a wonderful group of 1st grade readers this year! With our reading skills improving daily, we are already moving to our third reading book! Great job first graders!!!

2nd grade ~ Mrs. Bickett

I have a sign -up sheet posted outside my door for parent/teacher conferences which I will be holding on Tuesday, October 26th and Tuesday, November 2nd.

Bible: This week we see how Joshua called a meeting of all the people to ask them to decide whom they would serve and follow. Joshua chose to follow the Lord wholeheartedly and asked the people if they would serve and follow God wholeheartedly or not. A stone was set up in Shechem so the people would remember their promise to serve and follow the Lord faithfully.

Verse: Joshua 24:14: "Now fear the Lord and serve him with all faithfulness. Throw away the gods your forefathers worshiped beyond the River in Egypt, and serve the Lord." We will recite this verse on Friday.

Phonics and Language: distinguishing between declarative and interrogative sentences, double consonant suffix rule, and writing declarative and interrogative sentences.

2nd grade Continued...

Math: adding to twelve, subtracting from 12, writing numbers in the thousands, finding $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{1}{4}$ of a quantity, and measuring whole and half inches.

Spelling: We are working on list 9 spelling words, our test will be on Friday. Bonus words are: autumn, November, Tuesday, force, and gravity.

Science: We are finishing up insects and will begin learning about the scientific method and recognizing forms of energy.

3rd grade ~ Mrs. Glass

Bible - Memory Verse: Proverbs 15:29. This week we will be talking about our relationship with God through prayer. We will learn how God's love for us is never-ending.

English - We will work more with abbreviations. We will learn that names, initials, and titles of respect will be capitalized. Test over nouns will be on Friday.

Math - We will learn how to check our division problems, start multiplying by 5's, and learn bar graphs.

Spelling - List #9 Test Friday

History - We will learn about Paul Revere and Patrick Henry. Test over pages 55-90 next Wed, Oct 27.

Science - We will finish our chapter of animal habitats. Test over Chapter 8 tomorrow, Oct 20.

4th grade ~ Mrs. Odell

We are learning Colossians 1:15-17 – "He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. For by Him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities: all things were created by Him and for Him. He is before all things and in Him all things hold together." We are also learning Phil.2:5-11.

We will be working on double digit division and more measurements – both standard and metric in math. We will test over chapter 5 and 6 in history by Friday, hopefully. We are beginning the marvelous world of birds in science! We are testing on list 9 in spelling Wednesday.

We have been enjoying *Charlotte's Web* as a class and we will be doing a few activities that go along with it.

Book-It needs to be completed by October 31. Our monthly goal is 300 minutes of "at-home" reading. So far 1 fourth grader has completed it and earned his pizza coupon.
