Kindergarten ~ Mrs. Ackerman

Here is a look at what we will be doing this week:

Phonics: New consonants and blends: *Rr* and *Ff.* Blends are a consonant and vowel sounded together. We will be adding a consonant to the end of a blend to make words.

Math: Review: 0 - 18, pennies, counting to 20, right/left, "number families," and writing numbers. New concepts: 19 and writing 8.

Social Studies – America, Our Great Country: In this unit, the students will be introduced to the history and geography of America. This week, the students will learn that the United States of America is part of our big world. They will also hear about Christopher Columbus.

Bible – Young Samuel: The students will know God calls Samuel to service. They will identify ways to serve. Please practice Joshua 3:9b.

In math class we will continue to learn about the fraction 1/4. We will count by 25's, tell time to quarter past the hour and a quarter til the hour. We will also work on the 10 addition family. We will start phonics chart 11 this week. We will continue to work on how to divide words into syllables and how to add on a suffix.

Parents thank you for remembering to sign your child's behavior chart and homework sheet. As of today we have earned 21 popcorn pieces towards our popcorn party. Only 3 more pieces to go!

3rd Grade ~ Mrs. Finley

Grandparents' Day was fun! I think everyone had a good time. It was nice to meet some of my students' grandparents.

In Bible class, we will learn about how Christians are to build our lives. Our memory verse tells us what we must do... Matthew 7: 24, 25 says; "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock." We will have a test over this verse this Thursday.

Our Spelling List 8 test will be this Friday.

In math this week, we will learn how to check division, count half dollars, and five as a divisor. We are finishing up our chapter about nouns in English. There will be a test on Wed.

We will also have a test Wednesday over vertebrates (chapter 3) in science.

This Friday is a half day because of a teacher in-service day. It is the last day of our first quarter already! Report cards come out next Wednesday. There will be an opportunity for Parent-Teacher conferences next week as well. I will let you know when those will be next week.

4th Grade ~ Mrs. Odell

We will be memorizing/singing Psalm 139:1-14. Please read this with your child. It holds such precious truths. God is omnipresent and omniscient and omnipotent and every child is so special to Him-- beautiful! We are also learning Colossians 1:15-17 – "He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. For by Him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities: all things were created by Him and for Him. He is before all things and in Him all things hold together."

We will be working on double digit division and more measurements – both standard and metric in math. We will be testing over chapters 5 and 6, and then we'll be starting the Great Awakening in history. We are finishing friendly letters and will be learning about verbs in language. We're beginning the marvelous world of birds in science! We are testing on list 9 in spelling Wednesday.

Please have your child finish their reading for the month of October to earn their Book-It rewards.

5th Grade Language Arts ~ Mrs. Van Den Bussche

In Literature the students will be taking a test over <u>Sounder</u> tomorrow. This is a big test which will count as 100 points. If the students have been reading, listening in class and participating, they will do just fine. Thursday and Friday we will watch the movie and compare it with the novel.

Spelling test tomorrow on list 9. Next week's spelling "list" will actually be the Pledge to the Christian Flag. The students will be responsible for knowing it from memory as well as for spelling all of the

6th Grade, Jr. High Science and History ~ Mrs. Cook

5th Grade History: Test over the Middle East is tomorrow.

6th Grade History: We finished our study of India. Now we are trying an Asian art form called Batik. Student should not wear nice clothing as we will be using dyes.

7th/8th Grades History: We are learning about Rome's rise to power. Julius Caesar will be our focus. Rubric went home on projects last week. We will have lighter homework over these next two weeks, so work on those projects. There will be a quiz over readings from Chapter 7, pp. 68-74 on Thursday.

5th Grade Science: Tested today; we will move on to Geology this week.

6th Grade Science: We are half way through our Geology study. We are pausing this week to do some hands-on observations. Both 5th & 6th graders did an awesome job presenting their projects! Those should go home by Thursday. These counted as a completion grade, everyone that brought one gets full credit. Extra points were rewarded for extra effort.

7th/8th Grade Science: Our study began on Healthy Living today.
