I folded five pieces of copy paper in half and put a folded piece of construction paper around them for a cover. Once I'd stapled the spine, my children were able to title and decorate it.

At least once a week, they made an entry, describing a blessing, an answered prayer, happy news or a fun activity. I was surprised at how quickly the book filled up. This simple activity helped my kids realize how blessed they are and cultivated thankful hearts.

This week in Phonics the letters W, w and V, v will be introduced for recognition, sound and blends as we continue to read letters, sounds, blends and words. We will make sentences with our word cards reviewing our rules for a sentence. "Every sentence begins with a capital letter and most sentences end in a period. Sentences are usually made up of more than one word." Word end sounds will be identified and the students will choose the correct letter to complete a word. Wow! We are reading sentences.

The double consonant rule will be reviewed with a song. "If a word ends in c and k or a double consonant, you say the sound just once."

Kindergarten Continued...

We are making a book of the sentences we read and illustrate. Our new sight words; one, two, red and green have been added to I, the, to, do and a. Flash cards should be coming home soon.

The new letters and reviewed letters will be written in Handwriting. The boys and girls are carefully writing their letters and producing beautiful handwriting. Take a look at our wall outside our room for best choices to represent their handwriting.



In Social Studies we will continue "America, Our Great Nation. We will discuss Pilgrims and Indians and the first Thanksgiving. This week the students will bring home a large feather to decorate to add to our Tom the Turkey. Please use anything your have at home to decorate. Try not to make it too heavy as it needs to stay up on the wall. Please send the finished feather back to school next Monday, Nov. 11th.

In Numbers our store will be open again for purchases counting out the right amount of pennies that the price tag says. We have introduced the 30 and 40 families will be introduced. We will write the number 10 and match clocks to review o'clock times. The students will have a written evaluation and counting to 30. We have fun with our clocks, making the hours to o'clock.

We are getting ready to start addition with +1.

1st grade ~ Mrs. Wilson

Bible - This week we will learn about Ruth. Our memory verse is "Therefore as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers." Galatians 6:10

Phonics – This week we will continue to review root words and suffixes and syllables. We will learn the double consonant syllable rule – A long word may be divided between double consonants. The two consonants keep the first vowel short (ex. kitten). We will learn how to mark a word with a suffix. We underline the root word and circle the suffix.

This week's special sounds are -ong in long, -ung in strung, -ank in bank, -ink in wink, -onk in honk, and -unk in trunk.

Math – This week we will learn about the 8 subtraction family, hundreds place, identify ½ of a whole and ½ of a group, and understand the difference between A.M. and P.M. We will review our 8 addition family facts, before and after numbers by twos, telling time to the hour, and months of the year.

Spelling – please practice week #11 words at home.

Please check FISH binders for homework assignments. Thank you, parents, for initialing the homework sheets! We have sixteen tallies and need just four more for our class popcorn party!

2nd grade ~ Mrs. Bickett

We have earned our first popcorn party and have started working towards our second one! Thank you parents for signing homework sheets! We are still collecting things for our shoeboxes. We need 3 to 6 washcloths, another bar of soap, another toothbrush.



In Bible class this week we are continuing to learn about Ruth. This week we see how Ruth loved and served her mother-in-law Naomi and how God blessed her for it. We are reviewing all memory passages we have learned so far this year. We will begin a new passage next week.

In math class we will learn the 14 addition family, perimeter of a square, and working story problems with unneeded information. In phonics and language we will continue to identify the 4 types of sentences, add suffixes and prefixes to root words, and we will learn about using proof readers marks to fix sentences.

Spelling test 11 will be given on Friday. In history we are learning about Americans whose inventions changed the world, who were creative, who had great courage during war and on the mission field.

We will start learning cursive sometime this week.
