Phonics: New consonants and blends: *Xx* and *Zz*. Xx does not have any blends because it is usually found in the middle or at the end of a word. I will introduce the question mark.

Math: Review: Reading clocks set to the hour, adding on one, pennies, counting to 69, and naming numbers. New concepts: counting to 79, the 60 and 70 families, and after numbers.

Social Studies – America, Our Great Country: In this unit, the students will be introduced to the history and geography of America. This week, the students will learn about Abraham Lincoln and George Washington Carver.

Bible – **Thanksgiving:** The students will know that the book of Psalms contains many ways to give thanks to God. They will express their thanks to God in a variety of ways. Please practice Psalm 106:1.

"Jesus Teaches Us How to Love" and "Jesus Teaches Us How to Live Forever" are the themes we are learning about in Bible this week. Our new memory verse is John 3:16. It is copied on the back of the homework sheet. The test over it will be on Tuesday, November 25.

Our Spelling List 12 test will be this Friday. We will not have a Spelling list next week.

In math this week, we will learn how to find the unknown number in an equation (algebra!). This is one of my favorite lessons to teach! J We will also learn how to multiply and divide money and how to measure to the nearest centimeter.

We are learning about verbs in English this week. We have learned about present, past, and future tense verbs and helping verbs. We will also learn about irregular verbs and prefixes.

In science, we will be learning about desert life and exploring the ocean.
