# Kindergarten ~ Mrs. Bullington

Hey Kindergarten Families, we are having another great week of learning and fun!

In Bible, we are talking about the Trinity and what God is like. In Bible memory we have memorized Psalm 1:1-3, Psalm 23, and Romans 3:19-26, and are beginning Romans 4:2-5

In phonics, we are practicing consonant clusters and learning the special sounds "all" and "igh". I am doing individual reading with each child to help them each read to their full potential!

Readers that come home are not mandatory, but the more practice your child gets, the quicker they will take off with their reading! Some nights you may be too busy to do readers, and other nights your child may even be asking to read it twice through—whatever works for your family. When they have read their reader 6 times between home and school (there are spots to sign on the back!), they get a prize! These kids are doing amazing! If you have any questions about how to help your child with his/her reader, please ask!

In numbers, we are learning about number families and identifying numbers over 10.

#### 2nd grade ~ Mrs. Bickett

Book It forms for November are due back this week by Friday. Progress reports will come home on Wednesday this week.

Bible: We are learning how Elijah trusted God to provide for him during the 3 year drought brought on by Israel's disobedience. We will review Psalm 100 this week. Students will recite Psalm 100 on Friday.

Phonics and Language: This week we are continuing to identify nouns. We will learn the spelling rules for making nouns plural by adding s, es, or changing y to i and adding es.

Spelling: We are studying list 14 words. Bonus words are: because, usually, knife, Genesis, and Messiah. Spelling test 14 will be given on Friday.

Math: We will learn the 15 addition family, adding 3 digit numbers with carrying to the tens and hundreds places, adding 3 addends with 2 or 3 digits, and how to measure capacity (cups, pints, quarts, and gallons).

Science: We are learning about the weather and outer space.

Handwriting: We will learn Dd, Ff, Gg, Hh and Ji in cursive this week.

## 3rd grade ~ Mrs. Glass

Bible - Memory Verse: Ephesians 4:32. This week, we will focus on forgiveness and learn how to forgive. When I repent of my sins, God is faithful to forgive me.

English - We will learn how to address an envelope. We'll also learn direct and indirect quotations, using quotation marks.

Math - We will start the first steps to algebra and work with story problems.
