John 15:18-27

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18 If the world hates you, you know that it hated Me before it hated you. 19 If you were of the world, the world would love its own. Yet because you are not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, therefore the world hates you. 20 Remember the world that I said to you, A servant is not greater than his master. If they persecuted Me, they will also persecute you. If they kept My word, they will keep yours also. 21 But all these things they will do to you for My name's sake, because they do nt know Him who sent Me. 22 If I had not come and spoken to them, they would have no sin, but now they have no excuse for their sin. 23 He who hates the Me hates My Father also. 24 If I had not done among them the works which no one else did, they would have no sin; but now they have seen and also hated both Me and My Father. 25 But this happened that the word might be fulfilled which is written in their law, "They hated Me without a cause." 26 But when the Helper comes, whom I shall send to you from the father, the Spirit of truth who proceeds from the Father, He will testify of Me. 27 And you also will bear witness, because you have been with Me from the beginning.

There will be times, dear ones, when we will feel like it is us against the world. In some ways this is very true. Jesus in this text is preparing His disciples for ministry of the New Covenant of grace, to a not only a lost world but also a hostile world. The battle against the redemptive plan and purposes of God go back to the beginning of time. We should not be surprised by struggles, obstacles and resistance that results when we share the Truth of who Jesus is and our absolute need for a Savior.

However, there is good news for you and me as soldiers of the cross. John 15:27 promises us the Helper, the Holy Spirit, to testify to us of all the riches of God. Let us cling to this truth through the days.

Kindergarten Tidbit ~ Mrs. Whitlock

We had a great time playing in the snow, last week. Thanks to you, we all had snow pants and boots so we could really enjoy the snow. Continue to send boots as it is muddy on the playground.

Progress reports will come home on Wednesday.

This week we will review the one vowel rule as we mark vowels, circle site words and identify special sounds.

Reading groups will be introduced and Seatwork rules explained and practiced.

We are using our Blend Books in Reading groups so please send them back to school each day when they come home. We will review rhyming words and spelling a word. There will be a Phonics evaluation this week.



In Numbers the 1 and 2 addition family, addition twins and the 80 number family will be introduced. Please continue to practice number formation and recognition at home with the flashcards. You may keep those at home as we have a set at school. There will be a Numbers evaluation this week.

In Social Studies we will finish up Washington D. C. and Abraham Lincoln.

Q, q and blends will be learned. This is our last letter and we are excited to begin our reading groups. We will review site words and practice spelling words.

Bible Time story is about Esther. She was clothed with favor. The Lord surrounds those who love Him, His righteous ones, "with favor . . as with a shield" Psalm 5:12. This was certainly true for Esther. Psalm 30:5". . His favor lasts a lifetime." Esther was strong in a hard situation. She thought more of the Jewish people than herself. She was a selfless person and God protected her so she could deliver His people.

We will practice selfless acts of kindness.

<u>1st grade ~ Mrs. Wilson</u>

Bible - This week we will learn about Elijah and the Widow. Our memory verse is "Each of you should look not only to your own interests, but also to the interests of others." Philippians 2:4

Phonics – This week we will learn and practice the double consonant suffix rule – when a root word ends with one consonant and the vowel is short, double the consonant before adding a suffix beginning with a vowel ex. run-running. This week's special sounds are -tch in patch, -ear in ear, and -ear in bear.

Math – This week we will learn to identify the difference between cups, pints, quarts, and gallons. We will introduce the 9 addition family facts. We will also be counting from 151-200, identifying one half dozen items and learn about the quarter. We will continue to review counting by 25's, telling time, and reading thermometers.

Spelling – please practice week #14 words at home.

2nd grade ~ Mrs. Bickett

December Book-It sheets have gone home with your student.

Students have chosen their speech material for the speech contest. A copy should have gone home with your child before Thanksgiving vacation. Please encourage your child to begin memorizing their poem, Scripture portion, or fable.

We will be having a spelling bee on Thursday, December 7th to decide who will be going to the ACSI spelling contest.



In Bible class this week we are continuing to learn about Elijah. This week we will see how Elijah was bold and willing to stand up for the Lord. Our Bible verse is 2 Corinthians 3:12: "Therefore, since we have such a hope, we are very bold." We will recite this verse on Friday. We will also have spelling test 14 on Friday. Bonus spelling words for the week are: splurge, usually, knife, Genesis, and Messiah.

In math classes this week we will work on the 15 subtraction family, liquid measures, elapsed time, boiling point of water, normal body, temperature, and adding whole numbers to mixed numbers.

In Phonics and Language class we will finish the special sounds on chart 13. We will learn about the difference between singular and plural nouns and how to make nouns plural by adding s or es or changing y to i. We will also learn about possessive nouns.

Bible - Memory verse: Luke 19:10 - "For the Son of Man came to seek and save what was lost." How lost we are until the day we accept Jesus as our Lord and Savior! Our word we are learning this week is evangelism.

Math - Our division problems are going to be harder and longer. We are going to be working with money (example: 1 quarter = 25¢, 9 dimes = 90¢, 2 pennies = 2¢). We will be starting our 6x's (example: 6x4 = 24, 6x6 = 36).

6th: Review sections 3.5 - 3.10, Test 6 Wednesday, then God's Great Universe (What is Space Like).

7th: Finish section 5.2, review then Quiz 14 Tuesday/Wednesday, then on to Evolution: A Retreat From Science.

8th: They will be working on building a bridge with 3x5 index cards that will withstand AT LEAST 30 times the actual weight of the bridge. Before building they have to calculate the theoretical weight of the bridge by calculating the weight of an index card and the weight of the glue used on an index card with no more than 1/2 inch width of glue per card. There are also height and width restrictions. This will be an on going project for a couple of weeks.
