#### <u>Kindergarten Tidbit - Mrs. Whitlock</u>

I was so glad to see all of our families at the Open House and Christmas Program. Thank you for stopping by our room and going on our Scavenger Hunt. Thanks too, for helping with the extra items for our room. I will send home a copy of the paper you signed up on. Thank you again so very much for your help.

The students are going to be excited this week. We will start our new "I Learn to Read" books during reading groups.

In Skills development we will look at "What is Missing", this could be a number, a group of objects or even a student. We will practice patterns, putting puzzles together, finding rhyming words and tying our shoes.

Proper formation of our names will be reviewed and practiced. We will write, sound, and read our letters.

The 90 family will be introduced and the 80 and 90 families will be drilled with flashcards and number formation presented with our number cards. We will write numbers up to 29 and there will be a number evaluation. Please, please practice number recognition at home. It is such a great help to your child.

We will be introducing twin addition facts with 0 and 1.

In Phonics we will say, spell, and read words. The one vowel rule will be reviewed. Every student needs to remember this rule. "When a word has just one vowel it usually says the short sound and we make a smile mark."

We will mark vowels, sound and read words. Reading sentences will include marking the vowel, underlining double consonants; including ck, nd, and nt. We will identify capital letters and periods or question marks. As the students read a sentence they will choose the correct final word that is missing for that sentence. Board work will include writing blends and words. We will play "Around the Room" with one vowel word flash cards.

In Social Studies we will continue to visit Mexico. If anyone would like to make us a Mexican snack, we would love it.

Bible Time story is about Esther. She was clothed with favor. The Lord surrounds those who love Him, His righteous ones, "with favor . . as with a shield" Psalm5:12. This was certainly true for Esther. Psalm 30:5 ". . His favor lasts a lifetime." Esther was strong in a hard situation. She thought more of the Jewish people than herself. She was a selfless person and God protected her so she could deliver His people.

God will give all of us, that love Him, strength and confidence to face challenges.

Remind yourself that you are His child, you are indeed surrounded by His mercy and crowned with His favor.

Our memory verse is "Be on your guard, stand firm in the faith, be men of courage, be strong. Do everything in love."

We will be working on spelling list 14 this week and next week. Students will not be tested over these spelling words except for fun. In math class we have been talking about the temperature reference points. We will also learn how to borrow in subtracting.

We are learning about verbs in English class. We will also be working on writing a friendly letter.

#### 3rd grade - Mrs. Cleary

#### 4th Grade - Mrs. Odell

We test on spelling list 15 Wednesday and then begin list 16. The science chapter on "Matter" is quite long and we won't be testing on it until next week. The history chapter for the "American War for Independence" should take us through next week, too.

#### 6-8 History, Language Arts, 7/8 Spanish - Mrs. Cook

6<sup>th</sup> **History** –We wrapped up our studies of the American War for Independence today. Tomorrow and Thursday we will look at how our countries government was formed. We have been reviewing our past chapters as well. Students should study their notes for Friday's test.

7<sup>th</sup> History- We have finished our studies of the Middle Ages and both art projects are done. Stop by our room and see our coat-of-arms and our stained glass replicas. We have finished our readings and are reviewing for our test.

8<sup>th</sup> History- Constitution class has just FIVE more lessons! We are reviewing and practicing for the big test. A practice test will be given next Wednesday. The real test will be next Friday. Our goal is that each student pass with a 76 % or better. This class is doing quite well and I expect that they will more than exceed that goal.

#### **Language Arts:**

6<sup>th</sup> L. Arts- We are on a Spelling test break, as we prepare for the ACSI Spelling Bee Qualifier. We will have an in class bee this Wednesday.

Also we are writing a formal essay about our heroes. We will begin the editing process today. Final copies are due Friday and may be printed at school.

7<sup>th</sup> L. Arts- We did a smashing job on our text novel *The Voyages of Doctor Doolittle*. We are back to more serious studies of classical short stories. We will be looking for theme and motif this week as we read. Also, we are beginning a unit about proper verb usage. This should add some zeal to our writings.

Next week we will begin a poetry unit.

7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade Spanish: 8<sup>th</sup> graders are moving right along with our studies. We are learning how to properly attach descriptions to our nouns. We are completing chapter 11 this week and should test next Tuesday if all goes well. Students should review their vocabulary for their vocabulary manual for chapters 8,9,10, and 11. I am amazed at how good their conversation has gotten!

7<sup>th</sup> graders have taken a break to enjoy some re-teaching from the book *Spanish is Fun!* This group is learning how to modify verbs so that they can say what they mean. They are putting forth great effort!
