Mrs. Bickett's Second Grade Note

Ready, Set, Grow! We're off to a great start of the 2025–2026 school year. I am amazed at how much this group of kids has grown over the summer! We are getting into a routine and learning our classroom rules.

This week we will have our first spelling test on Friday. List 1 words were put in travel folders last Friday. Please leave the list in their travel folder, as students will use it to copy their spelling words at school, as well as use it to study their words at home. Please quiz your child on their spelling words by having them spell them out loud for you or writing them down as you give them the word. This will help them prepare for their test on Friday.

Students will not have reading or math homework this week, but they will have spelling and verse homework. We are learning two verses: John 1:1, "In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God and the Word was God," and 2 Peter 1:21, "For no prophecy was ever produced by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit." A copy of the verses will be kept in their zipper pouch in their travel binder. Please make sure it gets put back in the zipper pouch when you're done going over it with your child.

Second Grade continued ...

Bible: We have learned that all Scripture is breathed out by God, that God created everything in six 24hour days, that God is eternal, omnipotent, omniscient, sovereign, and omnipresent. We have also looked at the 2 parts of the Bible and will begin learning the Books of the Bible in order.

Phonics and Language: review of vowels and consonants, one and two vowel rules, k/c rule, marking vowels and defining a sentence.

Math: addition families 1-6, pennies and dollar bills, writing before and after numbers, distinguishing between vertical and horizontal, left, right, and am and pm. place value.

History: America's flag and freedoms and geography terms and map skills

Hand writing: review of lower case letters

Reading: Fun with Friends and Handbook for Reading

Spelling: list 1 words
