K-5 Music ~ Mrs. Eggers

It was good to be back together today, enjoying music with one another!

Our afternoon classes (grades 1, 2, and 5) had an overview of what an orchestra is. They learned about the different sections of an orchestra... string, percussion, woodwinds, brass. We looked specifically at the string family (violin, viola, cello, bass, and harp). We are learning about the orchestra because we have visitors coming next time we meet (Sept. 25). The IL Valley Youth Symphony Orchestra will come and present to each class about string instruments. How exciting!

Today, our morning classes (grades K, 3, and 4) continued working with rhythms. We reviewed a couple new songs that help us practice these rhythms. We also worked on our vocal sight reading by reviewing solfege (Do Re Mi Fa So La Ti Do). Next time our morning classes meet, we will learn about the orchestra to get us ready for an Oct. 2 visit from IVYSO!

Parents and Grandparents, if you play an instrument, let me know. I'd love to schedule more guest visitors and give the students a chance to see and hear different musical instruments up close.

Music is a gift from God, and so are our musical abilities and talents! Praise be to Him!

2nd grade ~ Mrs. Bickett

Bible: We are continuing to learn about Moses and the Exodus from Egypt. We will see how God delivered the Hebrews when they were trapped by the Red Sea. We are continuing our verses in Romans. This week we will learn Romans 5:8: "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While were still sinners Christ died for us." Students should be able to recite this verse on Friday.

Phonics and Language: We are continuing to review charts 6, 7 and 8 special sounds. We are learning the definition of an interrogative sentence this week. An interrogative sentence asks a question and ends with a question mark. We will also continue to identify Declarative sentences.

Spelling: We are studying list 4 words. Bonus words are: Illinois, arithmetic, August, Wednesday, and terrific. Spelling test 4 will be given on Friday.

2nd grade Continued...

Math: We will review the 5, 6 and 7 subtraction families this week. We will also learn how to find half of a group by using our double math facts. Reading vertical bar graphs to find specific information will also be something we do this week.

History: We are continuing to learn about the pilgrims and what it was like to travel on the Mayflower and what life would have been like in 1620.

Handwriting: We are reviewing how to make upper case letters.

3rd grade ~ Mrs. Glass

Bible memory verse: Isaiah 6:8. this week we will learn about the first four men that Jesus chose to be his disciples. We will learn how Peter, Andrew, john, and James left everything behind to follow Jesus.

English: This week we will learn the comma rules, talk about our favorite snacks, and learn nouns. Quiz on Thursday

Math: We will learn some new measurements such as 2 cups=1 pint, 2 pints=1 quart, 4 quarts=1 gallon. We will continue to work with geometric shapes and start two digit multiplication. Test on Thursday

Spelling: List #4 with test on Friday

Science: Test over Chapter 7 on Wednesday

History: We will start learning about John Smith.
