Kindergarten ~ Miss Read

Hello, Kindergarten Families! Here is a look at what we will be doing this week:

Phonics: We will continue to review the special sounds and blends we have learned so far. Our new special sounds will be *sw in swim, spl in splash, spr in sprain,* and *scr in scream.* Continue reading at home!

Math: New concepts: The quarter and the 8 Addition Family. Review: "Before" numbers, Counting by 5's and 10's, clocks set to the half hour, pennies, nickels, and dimes, and the 1 – 7 Addition Families. **Science:** We are so excited to begin our Science lessons! The purpose of this curriculum, *God's World*, is to stimulate an interest for the world God has created. Through these lessons, students will understand that God has a plan for each part of His creation and He not only made each living thing but also cares for it. Each student will receive his or her own Science textbook to use throughout these lessons and keep at home at the end of Kindergarten! This week we begin with the unit **God's Plan for Me.** The first few lessons will introduce the students to the idea of being created by God. Please send a small (2.5 X 3 inch) picture of your child as a baby to school by Friday. We will glue the picture inside our book!

Bible – The Ten Lepers: The students will know that Jesus heals ten lepers, but only one returns to give thanks. They will learn to express thankfulness in their daily lives. We will discuss the word "praise" and understand that to "praise God" is to tell of some of the things you love about who God is and how great He is. They will know that they can place their hope in God because he is all-powerful. Please practice Psalm 100:4.

Other Notes:

- We will be doing a special Easter project during the last week in March. Please have your child bring a dozen plastic Easter eggs by this Friday, March 22.
- Please send a small (2.5 X 3 inch) picture of your child as a baby to school by Friday. We will glue the picture inside our Science book.

Here is a look at what we are doing in 2nd Grade:

<u>Bible</u>: We continue to study Jesus this week. This week we learn about compassion toward others. Students will study the parable of the prodigal son.

Our verse for this week is from Matthew 9:36, "When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd."

Spelling: We are working on List 25 this week. Our test will be Thursday.

Phonics: We have been working at applying our special sounds to our writing.

English: Students will be reading a short story and then writing a book report.

<u>Reading</u>: Reading homework will be Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday. In addition to their reading work, I will be assigning questions for the children to answer from the stories in their reader. Please check your child's homework sheet for their assignment.

<u>Math</u>: Keep studying addition, subtraction, and multiplication flashcards with your child daily. We will learn our 3 Division Table and 16 Addition Table this week. Students will have a math test on Tuesday.
